A STRENGTH IN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

At Puketaha School, we place a strong emphasis on **academic achievement** in core subjects such as **Reading, Writing, and Mathematics**, as well as in other areas of the curriculum. Our school-wide data reflects **high levels of achievement** among our students, which we attribute to our dedication to providing support and challenge to each learner, enabling them to reach their fullest potential.



E-LEARNING

Year 7 and 8 students have access to both **chromebooks and Ipads** which are **tools** used to support their in-class learning. Each student receives their own email account which is monitored through our school system. Students and whaanau also have the option to bring their own device to school. E-Learning supports **student's growth and technological confidence**.

HOME-LEARNING

Year 7 and 8 students receive weekly Home Learning activities which support their in-class learning. The Home Learning programme also allows students to develop their own **time-management strategies, organisational skills, independence and study skills**, which are useful tools as they progress to secondary school.



LEADERSHIP

Developing leadership skills is an important focus for all our intermediate-aged children, and, as a school, we look to develop these skills within all our students and offer opportunities fairly to all. Developing students' leadership skills promotes personal growth, prepares them for future challenges, enhances their self-confidence, organisational skills, and sense of purpose. These skills contribute to academic success, facilitate future learning, career readiness, and empower children to positively influence their peers. Ultimately, developing leadership skills during the intermediate years equips children with the tools they need to navigate the transition to high school, lay a strong foundation for their future, and become responsible and effective leaders in a range of contexts.



At Puketaha School, students are provided a range of opportunities to support their growth in this area. These include:

- Leading Monday morning assembly, in which all Year 8 learners are given multiple opportunities to lead.
- Leading termly Powerful Learning Assemblies.
- Big Buddy Mentoring Programme.
- Numerous leadership roles across the vast school and sporting events that take part over the year.
- Leading weekly in-class assemblies.
- Annual attendance opportunity at Young Leaders Day.
- Opportunities to support in-school sports teams (coaching/ mentoring.)
- All students have an active role in Production.
- Tongariro Leadership Camp
- Seen as role models and leaders across the school for our younger students.



MENTORING PROGRAMME



Our Mentoring Programme aims to develop leadership skills and provide leadership and mentoring opportunities to Year 7 and 8 students. The programme pairs these older students with younger students, aged 5 and 6 years old, creating a mutually beneficial relationship.

The younger students benefit from emotional support, positive feedback, and role-modelling provided by their Big Buddy, which in turn helps build their self-confidence and self-esteem. Meanwhile, the Big Buddies are able to develop their leadership and communication skills, and demonstrate care and support for their younger peers, while serving as role-models in the school and building their sense of citizenship.



Year 8 Science at St Paul's

Year 8 students attend St Paul's Collegiate school approximately 15 times a year to engage in additional Science lessons. These lessons deepen students' scientific understanding, allow them to undertake science experiments in a science lab and see first hand how a secondary school operates.



TECHNOLOGY LESSONS

Year 7 and 8 students at Puketaha School travel to Morrinsville Intermediate on a weekly basis to partake in Specialist Subjects such as Food Technology, Art, Robotics, Languages and Hard Materials. These technology subjects provide a well-rounded education that nurtures both the cognitive and practical skills of students. They offer a balance between academic learning and hands-on experiences, fostering the development of creativity, problem-solving abilities, critical thinking, and manual dexterity.



CAMP TONGARIRO

This 5-day camp at the Sir Edmond Hillary Outdoor Pursuits Centre, is a real highlight for our Year 7 and 8's and lifelong learning and memories are made. The camp has a focus on leadership, independence and self-belief. Students are supported to take risks and push through challenges.

Individuals work together in teams to explore the environment and learn skills such as kayaking, abseiling, rock climbing and caving.

Students are immersed in activities which explore leadership techniques and attributes, providing practical experiences for students to further develop and understand their own style of leadership.



THE ARTS

Our annual Roopuu Puaawai Production immerses our students into the Arts Curriculum with visual art, dance, drama and music. The students are involved with the production process and have active roles in designing and producing the scripts. Students develop their characters and costumes and perform on stage. We value this inclusive process to allow students to explore their gifts and talents and to be part of this rewarding and team building process.



KAPA HAKA

Elements of Te Reo Maaori are taught throughout the week, and students engage in weekly waiata. In addition, each learning environment participates in weekly Kapa Haka lessons, which further support in-class learning and allow learners to lead and perform waiata, haka and immerse themselves in the Maaori culture.



SPORT

At Puketaha School, we offer a range of sporting codes and have high engagement with these across the school. Puketaha School is part of the Eastern Waikato Country Schools (EWCS) Cluster. The cluster schools take turns hosting events throughout the year where learners can compete, offering students the next level of challenge in their chosen sport. Puketaha School also enters a team into the Intermediate-Aged Sports Camp each year. This week-long camp sees students compete across 30 sporting codes and participate in a Sports Cheer competition. Many of our Puketaha Students attend this camp; being an exciting opportunity for our students to compete against a wide range of other schools while representing our school.



COMMUNITY VOICE

We are so happy that we chose Puketaha school for our kids. Puketaha school is such a supportive environment for not only for our kids learning, but also for their wellbeing. Being a smaller school the teacher to student ratio is lower, so this allows the teachers to be able to work closely, alongside the kids on their learning journey together. This 'work alongside' culture in the school is not limited to the classroom. Teachers don't wait for reports or parent interviews to raise concerns or praise. They get to know the families too and will often pull us aside for a quick update on how the kids are doing.

Our kids have had some awesome opportunities with Puketaha School. Sports Camp, Kapa Haka, music, languages, Sir Edmund Hillary Outdoor pursuits in Tongariro to name but a few.

And possibly my favourite thing is the Puketaha School Community. The school works seamlessly with the community to make an inclusive, supportive, engaged and fun environment that parents and students alike WANT to be in.

Puketaha School holds a very special place in the hearts of our family. The buddy system where a Year 7 or 8 child teamed up with a junior school child encouraged a sense of whaanaungatanga and encouraged the older ones to be good role models to the younger ones. Our children still speak lovingly of their experiences at Puketaha and will take any chance to visit even now as teenagers and young adults. We can not speak more highly of Puketaha School and its staff. We are truly grateful for all they have done to love, support and equip our children for their future.
